# INTRODUCTION

It has been another historic year as we celebrated The King and Queen's Coronation. I was extremely honoured to have represented the Western Isles at the Coronation Service in Westminster Abbey on the 6<sup>th</sup> of May. This was followed by the Scottish National Service of Thanksgiving and Dedication at St Giles' Cathedral in Edinburgh on the 5<sup>th</sup> of July, attending alongside Comhairle Convener Cllr. Kenny Macleod, Mrs Gloria MacKillop from Berneray and her nephew Alasdair MacKillop Humphery. We were privileged to hear Joy Dunlop sing a Gaelic psalm written especially for the service by Paul Mealor, in recognition of Scotland's linguistic heritage.

Over 20 events to mark this memorable Coronation occasion were organised locally across the Western Isles and I'm extremely grateful to everyone who helped in so many different ways to celebrate this important event in our history.

It is always important to recognise people and organisations in our community that do things for others. This year we have three people who received honours from The King, we have two Coronation Champions and two voluntary community groups receiving The King Award's for Voluntary Service. Also, we had representation at the Coronation Windsor Concert and over 40 people attended the Garden Party at the Palace of Holyrood as well as five people who attended The Princess Wales Carol service at Westminster Abbey.

Congratulations to Annie MacSween DL and Ronald John Maclean on their MBE awards in the Birthday Honours list. Many congratulations; so well deserved.





We also congratulate retired Lord-Lieutenant Donald Martin DL for his CVO which was awarded by the King at The Palace of Holyrood in the summer.

Further, congratulations to retired Lord-Lieutenant Sandy Matheson CVO OBE DL who was granted the Freedom of the Western Isles by Comhairle nan Eilean Siar at a packed ceremony in the Town Hall on 31<sup>st</sup> July.

# **CORONATION CHAMPIONS**

We were delighted that two esteemed volunteers from the Western Isles were recognised for their dedicated community work and awarded Coronation Champion status. Mary Duff, from Ness, was recognised for her work with Taigh Dhonnchaidh Music and Arts Centre and Charlie Nicolson, from Stornoway, rewarded for his work with a number of organisations including Blythswood Lewis and Harris, Scottish Emergency Rescue Association and the Eilean Siar Foodbank.

Around 5,000 volunteers aged from 14 to 103 from all over the UK and supporting a range of causes were nominated. From these nominations, 500 volunteers were hand-picked by a judging panel, presided over by the Queen Consort, and crowned Coronation Champions.

Charlie Nicolson and Mary Duff were included amongst the 500 chosen for this prestigious national award in recognition of their high commitment to volunteering. In total, there were 55 awardees from Scotland.



The Coronation Champions received an official Coronation Champions pin badge, a signed certificate from Their Majesties, and an invite to a Royal Garden Party at The Palace of Holyrood.

More than 60 people gathered in the Territorial Army Drill Hall in Church Street, Stornoway on the 7<sup>th</sup> of August for Charlie Nicolson's Coronation Champion Award Presentation and by coincidence, there were five visitors from Moldova present as they spent a week in Lewis as part of their UK visit for the Moldova Support Group.



# UHI OUTER HEBRIDES GRADUATION CEREMONY

On the 23rd of August, I was honoured to attend the 2023 UHI Outer Hebrides graduation ceremony of its students, together with their friends, family, and staff. A small team of committed volunteers are working hard to create a multi-site museum around the shores of Loch Ewe dedicated to the Arctic Convoys. It was a pleasure to spend time with Bruce Hudson, one of the volunteer committee members, and hear about their plans and aspirations to develop this worthwhile project.

We extend our warmest congratulations to Norman "Dokus" Macdonald, Uig, Lewis on his award of the OBE in the New Year Honours List announced on 30 December. Norman's long and distinguished service to the communities of Uig and the Western Isles has been justly recognised by this award.

It was equally pleasing to see Malina Macleod, Lochportain, North Uist receiving the award of the MBE for her outstanding service in social care and health to the North Uist community. Malina, dedicated herself to a career in nursing and social care for over 60 years.

Both Norman and Malina have provided an outstanding service to our communities, in their various roles, for a considerable length of time and we are delighted that their contribution has been recognised with this prestigious honour.

### 80<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE LIBERATOR USA AF B24, NORTH LEE, LOCHMADDY

The USA AF B24 Liberator crashed on North Lee, Lochmaddy on the 15<sup>th</sup> September 1943 with the loss of 10 US airmen. A service took place on Friday 15th September 2023 at the Clachan War Memorial to commemorate the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the crash. The service was led by Rev Alen McCulloch, followed by a two-minute silence and the laying of a wreath by the Lord-Lieutenant.

### KING'S AWARD FOR VOLUNTARY SERVICE

We were delighted that two Western Isles voluntary organisations, SHARE based in South Uist and Lewis based Long Term Conditions Hebrides were awarded The King's Award for Voluntary Service. This is the highest award a local voluntary group can receive in the UK and is equivalent to an MBE.

The two charities are amongst the 262 winners from across the UK and 20 from Scotland, who received the prestigious award this year. It's particularly noteworthy that the representation of the Western Isles in the list of winners demonstrates just how well the area is represented within a national context.

The King's Award for Voluntary Service recognises outstanding work by local volunteer groups that benefit their communities. It was created in 2002 to celebrate Queen Elizabeth II's Golden Jubilee and, following his accession, His Majesty The King emphasised his desire to continue the Award.

SHARE operates a thrift shop and café in Daliburgh, South Uist and reaches out to older people in the community, some of whom are lonely and isolated. It stands out for being a complete volunteer-led organisation that provides services which fill a gap in local service provision. It also reduces household expenditure on books and clothes and reduces the community's carbon footprint. Incredibly, SHARE has distributed over £80,000 to other worthy local causes. This is an amazing contribution and all achieved through an extraordinary successful and well operated volunteer group.

Long Term Conditions Hebrides (LTCH) provides support, advice and guidance to people living with Long Term Conditions in Lewis and Harris. This well managed group is volunteer-led in terms of direction and oversight and has been a "self-starter" organisation, providing support for people who suffer from anxiety, lack confidence, are socially isolated or who are dealing with mental well-being matters. It uses social media to promote its services, working hard to reach out to individuals who may benefit from the support available. Strong links with local GP practices is a significant factor in its success and strengthens the profile and reputation of Long Term Conditions Hebrides within our community.



### PRINCESS OF WALES CAROL SERVICE IN WESTMINSTER ABBEY

Tom Clark and his wife Donna, from Point in Lewis, were among the five Western Isles attendees at the Carol Service.

We're very pleased that we are able to fill our allocation of invitations, particularly due to the time and cost of attending from the Western Isles.

The service was subsequently broadcast on Christmas Eve, and is becoming a regular feature of the UK's Christmas celebrations.

# **2024 ROYAL GARDEN PARTY**

We expect to receive the official invitation for nominations for the 2024 Royal Garden Party at the Palace of Holyrood shortly. Offering a Garden Party invite to some of our deserving community volunteers is a real pleasure and we continue to fill our allocated spaces every year.
